2.04.010 Meetings. The city council shall meet on the second and fourth Tuesdays of each month, at the hour of seven-thirty p.m., at the city council chambers, City Hall, 3rd and Solano Streets, Corning, California or at such other location within the city as posted at the council chambers at least forty-eight hours prior to any regular meeting. (Ord. 488 §1, 1989; Ord. 374 §1, 1981; Ord. 240 §1, 1968; Ord. 192 §1, 1963).

2.04.020 Compensation. Pursuant to the authority contained in Section 36516 of the Government Code of California, each member of the city council of the city of Corning shall receive a salary, which shall be in the sum of three hundred dollars per month, which salary shall be paid to the members of the city council monthly. The city council members shall not be eligible to participate in any health and welfare program or retirement program available to the employees of the city of Corning. (Ord. 612 §1, 2004; Ord. 376 §1, 1981).

2.08.010 Clerk--Salary. The salary of the city clerk shall be three hundred and fifty dollars per month, commencing July 1, 1966. (Ord. 220 §1, 1966).

2.08.020 Clerk--Duties. The duties of the city clerk shall be those fixed by law. (Ord. 220 §2, 1966).

2.08.030 Treasurer--Salary. The salary of the city treasurer of the City shall be fifty dollars per month. (Ord. 161 §2, 1959).

2.08.040 Treasurer--Duties. The duties of the city treasurer shall be only such as are expressly required by law to be performed by the city treasurer. (Ord. 161 §4, 1959).

2.08.050 Clerk and treasurer--Deputies. The city clerk and the city treasurer shall have the authority to appoint such deputies as are required for a complete performance of the duties of the respective officers, but the salaries or wages of such deputies or employees shall be fixed by the city council, and the city council shall approve the employment of such deputy or employee. In the absence of the approval of such employment, such employee shall not be employed. The city council may designate the mayor or some other officer to approve or disapprove the employment of any deputy or employee on behalf of the city council. (Ord. 161 §5, 1959).
