### VACATIONS:

### CITY MANAGER:

#### Waste Management Negotiations:

Waste Management provided a revised commercial rate proposal for City staff to review.

#### Recreation and Youth Enrichment Program:

Molly and I met with the Promise Neighborhood Grant Manager Dawna Holiday-Shchedrov and the marketing and outreach staff person, Siana Sinoque on April 18<sup>th</sup> to discuss ways to better market the Recreation and Youth Enrichment Program and reach at-risk youth.

#### FY 2019/2020 Budget Development:

City CPA Roy Seiler and I will begin to compile the FY 2019/20 proposed budget on April 29<sup>th</sup>. All Departments submitted their proposed budgets and Capital Improvement Programs for review. Thank you all for your hard work.

#### Shelter Services Agreement:

Tom Watson and I met with Tehama County Chief Administrator Bill Goodwin and Agricultural Commissioner Rick Gurrola to finalize negotiations for the Animal Shelter Services Agreement. It appears we will be able to come to agreement with the County to assume shelter services for Corning dogs in October 2019. As part of the Agreement, the Animal Control Officer will transport dogs to the County Animal Shelter. At that point, the Corning Animal Shelter will permanently close.

#### Prop 68 Park Development Grant Application:

The Council will be asked to choose one of four potential locations for the park facility grant. The locations that would be competitive are as follows: Northside Park, 6<sup>th</sup> and Yolo Street Property owned by the City along with the Patterson property, southside of Solano Street between 3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> streets (Solano Street location), and Woodson Park. I will present benefits and drawbacks of each location. We received confirmation the grant will fund underground storage tank removal at the Solano Street location. The first of five community meetings will be held April 29<sup>th</sup> at 5:00 PM at the Council Chambers to discuss recreation features to be included at the chosen park.

I will be attending the Northern California Cities Self Insurance Fund (NCCSIF) Board of Directors meeting on April 25<sup>th</sup>.

### PLANNING DEPARTMENT:

Molly will be on vacation on the east coast starting Friday, April 19<sup>th</sup> and returning Tuesday, April 30<sup>th</sup>. Part-Time Planning Consultant John Stoufer will be covering while she is out.

## **PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT:**

### **Energy Conservation Project:**

Aircon Energy has completed the installation of the heaters at the Corporation Yard and the Fire Department in addition to completing the installation of the well pump motors at the 3 wells. The final item of work is to replace the 2 HVAC units at City Hall, and it is anticipated that this work will start within the next two weeks. We are still on track for completing this work mid-May.

## **POLICE DEPARTMENT:**

### **Patrol:**

In addition to responding to 193 calls for service, a total of 39 officer reports were taken and there were 179 officer-initiated incidents, including 94 traffic stops. Officers made 20 misdemeanor and 5 felony arrests. Officers issued 26 citations, of which; 20 were misdemeanors, and 6 were infractions during the period of April 10, 2019 through April 17, 2019.

### **Training:**

Officers continue to participate in POST Portal Training and Lexipol Daily Training Bulletins. Other POST on-line training continues for Patrol and Dispatch personnel.

### **Vehicle Abatement:**

Due to the continuing light-duty of CSO Robbins, no vehicle abatement has been initiated.

## **FIRE DEPARTMENT:**

### **Corning Volunteer Fire Department Call Volume:**

The Corning Volunteer Fire Department responded to 24 calls for service last week; they consisted of 21 medicals, 1 fire, 1 mutual aid fire and 1 investigation.

### **Orland Volunteer Fire Department Call Volume:**

The Orland Volunteer Fire Department responded to 9 calls for service last week, they consisted of 4 medicals, 3 fires, 1 hazardous condition, and 1 investigation.

### **Capay Volunteer Fire Department Call Volume:**

The Capay Volunteer Fire Department was dispatched to 0 calls last week.

### **Training:**

Training for the Corning Volunteer Fire Department consisted of back boarding, removing a person from a vehicle, and child from a car seat.

### **Receipt of New Engine 12:**

The Department's new Engine 12 is to be delivered this weekend and will be in service in the near future.
