CITY MANAGER:

Proposition 68 Park Development and Community Revitalization Grant:

The City Council chose the location to be included in the grant application; the location will be the south side of Solano Street between Third and Fourth Streets. If the City is awarded the Grant, it will fund clean-up of the known underground storage tanks on the property. At least five "Community Meetings" will be held to allow the Community to choose the recreational features and their respective location within the proposed Park. The first Community Meeting will be held on Monday, April 29th at 5:00 p.m. in the Corning City Council Chambers at 794 Third Street.

FY 2019/2020 Budget Development:

I met with Department Heads on April 22nd to review their Budget Proposals. I will meet with City CPA Roy Seiler on April 29th to begin to compile the 2019/2020 Fiscal Year Budget.

Food Truck Tuesday:

The first "Food Truck Tuesday" event will take place on May 7th from 5-8 p.m. on Solano Street between 6th Street and 4th Street; Inside Straits (Band) will be performing from 6-8 p.m.

Community Events:

POLICE DEPARTMENT:

Patrol:

In addition to responding to 176 calls for service, a total of 36 officer reports were taken and there were 101 officer-initiated incidents, including 67 traffic stops. Officers made 16 misdemeanor and 4 felony arrests. Officers issued 19 citations, of which; 3 were felonies, and 14 were misdemeanors, and 2 were infractions during the period of April 17, 2019 through April 24, 2019.

FIRE DEPARTMENT:

Corning Volunteer Fire Department Call Volume:

The Corning Volunteer Fire Department responded to 20 calls for service last week; they consisted of 15 medicals, 2 fires, and 3 public safety.

Orland and Capay Volunteer Fire Department Call Volumes:

The Orland and Capay Volunteer Fire Departments responded to 17 calls for service last week, they consisted of 11 medicals, 2 fires, and 4 traffic collisions.

Training:

Training for the Corning Volunteer Fire Department consisted of cleaning and review of all cabinets and apparatus. Twenty (20) Volunteers spent 4 hours in an orientation on the operation and use of our new Engine 12.
