CITY MANAGER:

Economic Development Action Committee Meeting:

I will be attending the Corning Economic Development Action Committee meeting on April 8th. The Committee is looking for local business and community members to take part in the Committee.

Promise Neighborhood Grant Marketing Meeting:

Molly Marcussen and I will be meeting with the Promise Marketing Team to discuss how we may partner to better market and work with each other.

FY 2019/20 Budget Preparation:

Capital Improvement Plans are due from City Department's on April 12th. Departmental budget proposals are due on April 19th.

Upcoming Meetings:

I will be attending the Tehama County City Manager's/Administrator's Meeting on April 18th.

PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT:

Energy Conservation Project:

Aircon Energy has been working on the installation of the heaters at the Corporation Yard this week and have scheduled the replacement of the well pump motors for next week if weather permits. We are still on track for completing this work mid-May.

Training:

The City of Corning will be hosting the NCCSIF (Northern California Cities Self Insurance Fund) Training: Heat Illness Prevention, Train-the Trainer on Thursday, April 11, 2019 from 9 a.m. to 12:00 p.m. City Employees will be attending as well as individuals from other Agencies.

Energy Conservation Project:

Aircon Energy will be back on-site starting April 2, 2019 to begin the installation of the Fire Department heaters followed by the Corporation Yard heaters, City Hall HVAC and the well pump motors. The preliminary schedule has them completing this work mid-May.

Public Works New Hire:

Wayne Spencer started March 27th as the City's new part-time Landscape Maintenance Worker. Welcome aboard Wayne

POLICE DEPARTMENT:

Patrol:

In addition to responding to 194 calls for service, a total of 21 officer reports were taken and there were 90 officer-initiated incidents, including 32 traffic stops. Officers made 9 misdemeanor and 1 felony arrests. Officers issued 7 citations, of which; 7 were misdemeanors, during the period of March 27, 2019 through April 3, 2019.

Training:

Officers continue to participate in POST Portal training and Lexipol Daily Training Bulletins. Other POST on-line training continues for Patrol and Dispatch personnel.

Vehicle Abatement:

Due to the continuing light-duty of CSO Robbins, no vehicle abatement has been initiated.

FIRE DEPARTMENT:

Corning Volunteer Fire Department Call Volume:

The Corning Volunteer Fire Department responded to 17 calls for service last week; they consisted of 16 medicals and 1 traffic collision.

Orland Volunteer Fire Department Call Volume:

The Orland Volunteer Fire Department responded to 14 calls for service last week, they consisted of 6 medicals, 3 fires, 4 traffic collisions, and 1 public service.

Capay Volunteer Fire Department Call Volume:

The Capay Volunteer Fire Department was dispatched to 1 medical.

Training:

Training for the Corning Volunteer Fire Department consisted of safe and proper use and placement of ground ladders.
