CITY MANAGER:

Meeting with Waste Management:

I met with Waste Management on July 29th via conference call to discuss some of the remaining items.

I will be meeting with HdL regarding our first quarter 2019 Sales Tax results on August 6th.

Prop 68 Park Development and Community Revitalization Grant:

The application is being finalized and will be submitted August 5th. We will be asking for the full \$8.5 million.

CITY CLERK:

August 13th Joint Special Meeting of the City Council & City Commissions (Planning, Airport, Recreation and Library):

There will be a Joint Special City Council Meeting held at 5:30 p.m. on Tuesday, August 13th (just prior to the regular City Council Meeting which starts at 6:30 p.m.) for training on Brown Act Law (Ralph M. Brown Act), Council/Commission Meeting Procedures/Protocol, and Conflict of Interest. The Agenda will be posted on the City's Website at www.corning.org late afternoon on the Friday prior to the Meeting. The Public is welcome to attend.

PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT:

City Hall Exterior Repair Project:

The Contractor, Cut-In Edge Painting has continued to work on the building repairs and painting. The project is anticipated to be completed by the end of this week.

Vandalism:

It has been discovered that someone is removing sod from the City Parks, all locations with the exception of Martini Plaza. Approximate 2'x3' sections of sod are being removed and it is assumed they are using them for personal use.

Janitorial Services:

City Staff has met with Alejandra Ochoa to negotiate a new 3-year contract starting on August 1st.

Planning:**SB 2 Planning Grant:**

City Staff has been meeting with HCD's SB 2 Planning Grants Consultant to complete the grant application. Consultant Mark Teague is reviewing the application and sending over comments. Staff hopes to have it sent in my August 9th.

Prop 68 Grant Mitigated Negative Declaration:

The Initial Study and Mitigated Negative Declaration for the Community Recreation Center and Plaza Project was filed at the Clerk and Records office July 31st.

Zoning and Land Use Map Updates:

California State University Chico Geographic Information Center (GIC) has completed much needed updates to the City's Zoning and Land use Map. Planning Staff has been utilizing a Zoning Map from 2006 that has not reflected the zoning changes made over the years. Planning Staff is incredibly excited for this update and is currently working with the GIC on revisions.

POLICE DEPARTMENT:**Patrol:**

In addition to responding to 202 calls for service, a total of 34 officer reports were taken and there were 128 officer-initiated incidents, including 59 traffic stops. Officers made 18 misdemeanor and 2 felony arrests. Officers issued 27 citations, of which; 15 were misdemeanors, 8 were parking, 1 was a felony and 3 were infractions during the period of July 24, 2019 through July 31, 2019.

Training:

Officers continue to participate in POST Portal Training and Lexipol Daily Training Bulletins. Other POST on-line training continues for Patrol and Dispatch personnel. One Officer attended Less Lethal Weapon Instructor course.

The Corning Volunteer Fire Department responded to 17 calls for service last week; they consisted of 14 medicals, 1 fire, and 2 public service.
