CITY MANAGER:

Food Truck Tuesday August 20th

The next Food Truck Tuesday is scheduled for August 20th. Food Truck Vendors are being finalized and will be announced closer to the event.

Economic Development:

The next Corning Economic Development Action Committee meeting is scheduled for August 12th. The Committee is continuing its efforts to improve facades specifically in downtown Corning.

The City has processed business licenses for two new businesses downtown on Solano Street.

Proposition 47- Restore Grant Reporting Meeting:

I am meeting with River Cities' Counseling and the Center for Evaluation and Research regarding upcoming grant reporting for the Board of State and Community Corrections Proposition 47 Grant that supports the Restore Program.

ADA Transition Plan:

Staff are working to finalize the ADA Transition Plan to present to Council in September.

Proposition 47 Cohort 1 and Cohort 2 Grants:

Quarterly progress reports and the Two-Year Evaluation Plan Report for the Proposition 47 Cohort 1 grant funded Restore Program are being finalized and will be submitted prior to the August 15th deadline. Cohort 1 will close on August 15, 2020.

Four Subcontractor Agreements for Cohort 2 are being developed by Staff to implement the \$3,535,485 Grant. As part of the Grant, the City will need to approve Agreements with River Cities Counseling, the Job Training Center, Empower Tehama, and the Center for Evaluation and Research. I am the Project Director and Authorized Officer administering the Grant. Mary Brimm is designated as the Financial Officer. The term of the Grant is August 15, 2019 through May 15, 2023.

PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT:

City Hall Exterior Repair Project:

The Contractor, Cut-In Edge Painting is completing the final touches to the City Hall Exterior Project.

Street Sweeping Debris:

For health and safety reasons the street sweeping dump location that has been in the Yost Parking lot by the railroad tracks has been moved to a vacant location at the City Airport.

Pool:

The City Pool's season is over, and the pool will be closing for regular season August 9th. There are a couple of post season parties and then the pool will be treated for off season closure.

New Intern:

City Staff welcomes David Albarran-Martinez; David will be interning at City Hall and is funded through the Job Training Center.

Training:

Public Works has scheduled a training with the California Highway Patrol (CHP) on Thursday, August 15, 2019. They will be going over driver and vehicle safety. CHP has been having general issues with safety and distracted drivers throughout California and believe it to be beneficial to proactively address these matters. The Public Works Crew will be attending, and an invite is extended to other City Departments.

POLICE DEPARTMENT:**Patrol:**

In addition to responding to 209 calls for service, a total of 49 officer reports were taken and there were 186 officer-initiated incidents, including 74 traffic stops. Officers made 20 misdemeanor and 2 felony arrests. Officers issued 27 citations, of which; 16 were misdemeanors, 6 were parking, 1 was unclassified, 6 were parking and 3 were infractions during the period of July 31, 2019 through August 7, 2019.

Training:

Officers continue to participate in POST Portal Training and Lexipol Daily Training Bulletins. Other POST on-line training continues for Patrol and Dispatch personnel.

FIRE DEPARTMENT:**Corning Volunteer Fire Department Call Volume:**

The Corning Volunteer Fire Department responded to 14 calls for service last week; they consisted of 11 medicals, 1 mutual aid fire, 1 traffic collision, and 1 public service.

These combined calls consisted of 7 medicals, 7 fires, 4 traffic collision, 1 public service, and 2 investigations.
