HOLIDAYS:

City Hall, Finance and the City Corporation Yard will be closed on the following days during the Holiday Season:

- Christmas: Monday and Tuesday, December 24th & 25th
- New Year's Day: Tuesday, January 1, 2019.

CITY MANAGER:

Camp Fire Displaced Residents Trailer and RV Parking at Estil Clark Park:

The City has opened the parking lot at Estil Clark Park for those individuals displaced by the recent Camp Fire having trailers and motor homes for temporary use. Proof of residence within the areas affected by the fire will be required and no tents will be allowed. We currently have one RV utilizing the site and are expecting a few more in the coming weeks.

Because the City does not have water/sewer hook-ups to accommodate this use, the City has contacted Big Valley Sanitation, Inc. of Redding who has agreed to provide sewer pump services to each trailer/motor home owner as needed at a cost of \$25 per service.

Holiday Luncheon:

The Annual Holiday Luncheon for City Staff, Volunteers, and Council Members will be December 14th at the Fire Hall; City Hall and the Finance Department will be closed from 12 p.m. to 1:30 p.m. for employees to attend. We will be recognizing Staff for their years of service. There will also be a white elephant gift exchange (\$10 maximum).

Corning Cash:

The Corning Chamber of Commerce sells "Corning Cash", which are essentially gift certificates that are good at eighteen (18) local businesses. "Corning Cash" is a wonderful gift to support the local Corning economy this holiday season.

PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT:

Community Event Street Closures:

Solano Street between Toomes Avenue and East Street will be closed on Sunday, December 9, 2018 from 10:30 a.m. to 12:00 p.m. The Immaculate Conception Church will be having their annual Feast Day of Our Lady of Guadalupe procession and celebration. In addition, they will be using Toomes Avenue at Solano Street as a staging area beginning at 10:00 a.m.

Leaf Pick Up:

The crew will continue leaf pick up as work schedules allow.

Public Works New Hire:

Newly hired Dom Rios started December 3rd as the City's new Meter Reader/Maintenance Worker. Dom fills the vacancy created by the retirement of Lee Blaylock who retired in October. Congratulations Dom and welcome aboard!

POLICE DEPARTMENT:

Patrol:

In addition to responding to 191 calls for service, a total of 43 officer reports were taken and there were 98 officer-initiated incidents, including 56 traffic stops. Officers made 21 misdemeanor and 3 felony arrests. Officers issued 26 citations, of which; 21 were misdemeanors and 5 were infractions during the period of November 28, 2018 through December 5, 2018.

Training:

Officers continue to participate in POST Portal Training and Lexipol Daily Training Bulletins. Other POST on-line training continues for Patrol and Dispatch personnel.

Vehicle Abatement:

Due to the continuing light-duty of CSO Robbins, no vehicle abatement has been initiated.

FIRE DEPARTMENT:

Call Volume:

The Corning Volunteer Fire Department responded to 25 calls for service last week. They were: 15 medicals, 5 public safety, and 4 fires.

Orland and Capay Fire Departments responded to a combined 20 calls for service last week consisting of 12 medicals, 5 fires, 2 traffic collisions and 1 public service.
