CITY MANAGER:

Recycle Night at the Theatre March 8TH:

The Tehama County Solid Waste Management Agency is partnering with the Corning Recreation Program to host Recycle Night at Rodgers Theatre. Activities and a craft will be offered to teach youth in our community how to recycle/reduce their waste. The movie 'Lorax' will be shown. Doors will open at 5:45 PM. This will be a free event. Advance registration will be required online through Corning Recreation.

Meetings:

- **Week of February 11th – 15th:** I will be attending the League of California Cities City Manager's Meeting as well as taking a few days off for a vacation. Chief Fears will be the Acting City Manager during my absence.

PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT:

Isolated Flooding Response:

Staff is monitoring weather conditions and responding as needed to areas of isolated flooding, inoperable traffic signals resulting from power outage (result of big rig hitting a power pole), lift station issues (problems with the generator), etc.

Road Closures:

- Blackburn at Toomes Avenue – near Woodson School due to flooding.
- Hwy. 99W reopened at Burch Creek Bridge as flood waters reduced.
- Toomes Avenue to Loleta is reopened for now as flood waters have reduced.

Displaced Camp Fire Victims from Woodson Bridge RV Park:

Due to flooding/predicted flooding at Woodson Bridge on South Avenue, as of Thursday, February 14th, there have been 9 trailers temporarily relocated to the parking lot at Clark Park. There will possibly be more; we have space for up to 28.

PLANNING/RECREATION DEPARTMENTS:

Planning:

Planning Staff received a second TDU (Temporary Dwelling Unit) permit application for a person displaced by the campfire. The trailer is located at 1461 South Street. Planning Staff is working with the person to get them a septic pumping contract and will accompany building and fire personnel to inspect water and power connections.

POLICE DEPARTMENT:

Patrol:

In addition to responding to 182 calls for service, a total of 51 officer reports were taken and there were 121 officer-initiated incidents, including 75 traffic stops. Officers made 18 misdemeanor and 1 felony arrests. Officers issued 27 citations, of which; 18 were misdemeanors, and 7 were infractions during the period of February 6, 2019 through February 13, 2019.

Training:

Officers continue to participate in POST Portal Training and Lexipol Daily Training Bulletins. Other POST on-line training continues for Patrol and Dispatch personnel. Three officers attended the Field Training Officer Update in Napa, CA.

Vehicle Abatement:

Due to the continuing light-duty of CSO Robbins, no vehicle abatement has been initiated.

FIRE DEPARTMENT:

Call Volume:

The Corning Volunteer Fire Department responded to 23 calls for service last week; they consisted of 18 medicals, 4 fire, 1 public service.

Orland and Capay Volunteer Fire Department Call Volumes:

The Orland and Capay Volunteer Fire Departments responded to 14 calls for service last week; they consisted of 10 medicals, 3 fires, and 1 public service.

Events:

The monthly business meeting was attended by 23 of the City's Volunteer Fire Department Members. Daymon Schlereth was named the Department's "Fireman of the Year" at the Departments annual Awards Dinner.
