### **CITY MANAGER:**

#### **Recycle Night at the Theatre March 8<sup>TH</sup>:**

The Tehama County Solid Waste Management Agency is partnering with the Corning Recreation Program to host Recycle Night at Rodgers Theatre. Activities and a craft will be offered to teach youth in our community how to recycle/reduce their waste. The movie 'Lorax' will be shown. Doors will open at 5:45 PM. This will be a free event. Advance registration will be required online through Corning Recreation.

#### **Mid-Year Budget:**

I will be presenting the Mid-Year Budget report to the City Council on February 26, 2019. The total fund balance projected as of June 30, 2019 will be approximately \$2,631,575. This accounts to a \$1,671,695 increase from June 30, 2016. These fund reserves are necessary to provide stability within the City during the next economic downturn.

#### **City Manager's Meeting and Conference:**

I attended the statewide City Manager's Department Meeting in San Diego February 13-15, 2019. Of highlight was natural disaster preparedness, sexual harassment prevention, and how to create a productive and thriving workplace.

#### **One Stop Navigation Center:**

The County and the Cities of Red Bluff and Corning adopted the Resolution authorizing the County of Tehama to apply for a Community Development Block Grant to fund a One Stop Navigation Center and Shelter in Red Bluff.

#### **Annual Financial Statements:**

The City's annual financial statements are being finalized and will be presented at the March 12<sup>th</sup> City Council meeting.

#### **Proposition 47 Cycle 2 Grant Application:**

It appears the City will be the lead applicant for the Cycle 2 grant application. Stakeholders are proposing to expand the current County-wide Adolescent Diversion (Restore) Program to Transitional Aged - Youth (ages 18-26). The application is due March 18, 2019.

### **PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT:**

#### **City Pool:**

There are 12 Lifeguards who operate and maintain the City Pool during the swim season. Public Works has invited all 12 guards to return for the upcoming season and 5 have responded favorably. After February 22<sup>nd</sup>, the Public Works Department will advertise to fill the remaining Lifeguard positions. The pool is scheduled to open on Monday June 10<sup>th</sup>.

#### **Storm Response:**

Thank You to all the Public Works Staff for their hard work during the recent storms; cleaning storm drains, blocking flooded roadways and emergency response due to power outages.
