CITY MANAGER:

Mid-Year Budget Review:

I presented the Mid-Year Budget report to the City Council on February 25, 2020. The total fund balance projected as of June 30, 2020 will be approximately \$2,245,936 for the General Fund and \$1,180,209 for the Measure A fund. These fund reserves are necessary to provide stability within the City during the next economic downturn.

Annual Financial Statements:

The City's annual financial statements were also presented to the City Council on February 25, 2020. The Total General Fund fund balance at June 30, 2019 was \$2,373,527. This represents a \$708,761 increase from June 30, 2018. General Fund revenues increased in 2018/2019 by \$650,220, or 10.33% over the previous year. These increases were largely due to increases in sales tax, transactions and use tax (Measure A), and transient occupancy taxes as a result from the Camp Fire. They are short-term increases in revenue.

Proposition 68 Park Development and Community Revitalization Grant:

The City unfortunately did not receive the grant funds.

COVID-19:

City Staff will be meeting with the County Public Health Officer on Tuesday March 3rd regarding COVID-19. City Staff are beginning to prepare plans and policies should a pandemic occur. The County Public Health Department has an Infectious Disease Plan they would initiate as well.

West Street Closure Ad-Hoc Committee:

The West Street Closure Ad-Hoc Committee will be meeting March 3rd regarding the possible permanent closure of West Street between Marin and South streets.

Sustainable Groundwater Management Act:

I will be meeting with Ryan Teubert on March 3rd regarding the Sustainable Groundwater Management Act.

PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT:

Grading in the Alleys:

City Staff has been busy using the new Skip Loader to perform maintenance work, including grading within the alleys throughout the City. They have also been busy removing the stumps of City trees that have been recently cut down.

PLANNING DEPARTMENT:

Food Truck Tuesdays:

This year's "Food Truck Tuesday" events will take place on May 19th, July 21st, August 18th, and October 6th. The location and time for the events is Solano Street between 4th and 5th Streets from 5 p.m. to 8 p.m. (See attached Flyer).

Spring 2020 Recreation & Enrichment Activities:

Registration begins on March 1, 2020 for the Spring 2020 Recreation and Enrichment Activities which include the following activities: Dance, Kids & Teen Art, Reading Club, Robotics, Sports Rec, Tiny Tots, Video Game Programming and more. (See attached flyer for registration informant).

POLICE DEPARTMENT:

Patrol:

In addition to responding to 136 calls for service, a total of 24 officer reports were taken and there were 125 officer-initiated incidents, including 66 traffic stops. Officers made 16 misdemeanor and 1 felony arrests. Officers issued 25 citations, of which; 10 were misdemeanors, 4 were parking, 2 was unclassified and 9 were infractions during the period of February 20, 2020 through February 26, 2020.

Training:

Officers continue to participate in POST Portal Training and Lexipol Daily Training Bulletins. Other POST on-line training continues for Patrol and Dispatch personnel.

FIRE DEPARTMENT:

Corning Volunteer Fire Department Call Volume:

The Corning Volunteer Fire Department responded to 21 calls for service last week; they consisted of: 15 medicals, 1 fire, 2 traffic collisions, and 3 public service.

The Orland, Capay, Butte City, Bayliss, Glenn Codora and Artois Volunteer Fire Departments Call Volume:

The Orland, Capay, Butte City, Bayliss, Glenn Codora and Artois Volunteer Fire Departments were dispatched to a combined total of 18 calls for service last week. These consisted off: 11 medicals, 4 fires, and 3 traffic collision.

Training:

Training for the Corning Volunteer Fire Department consisted of inventory and operations on Engines 6 and 9.

Burn Permits:

Make sure you have a Burn Permit to burn in the City and call before burning yard trimmings only!!!

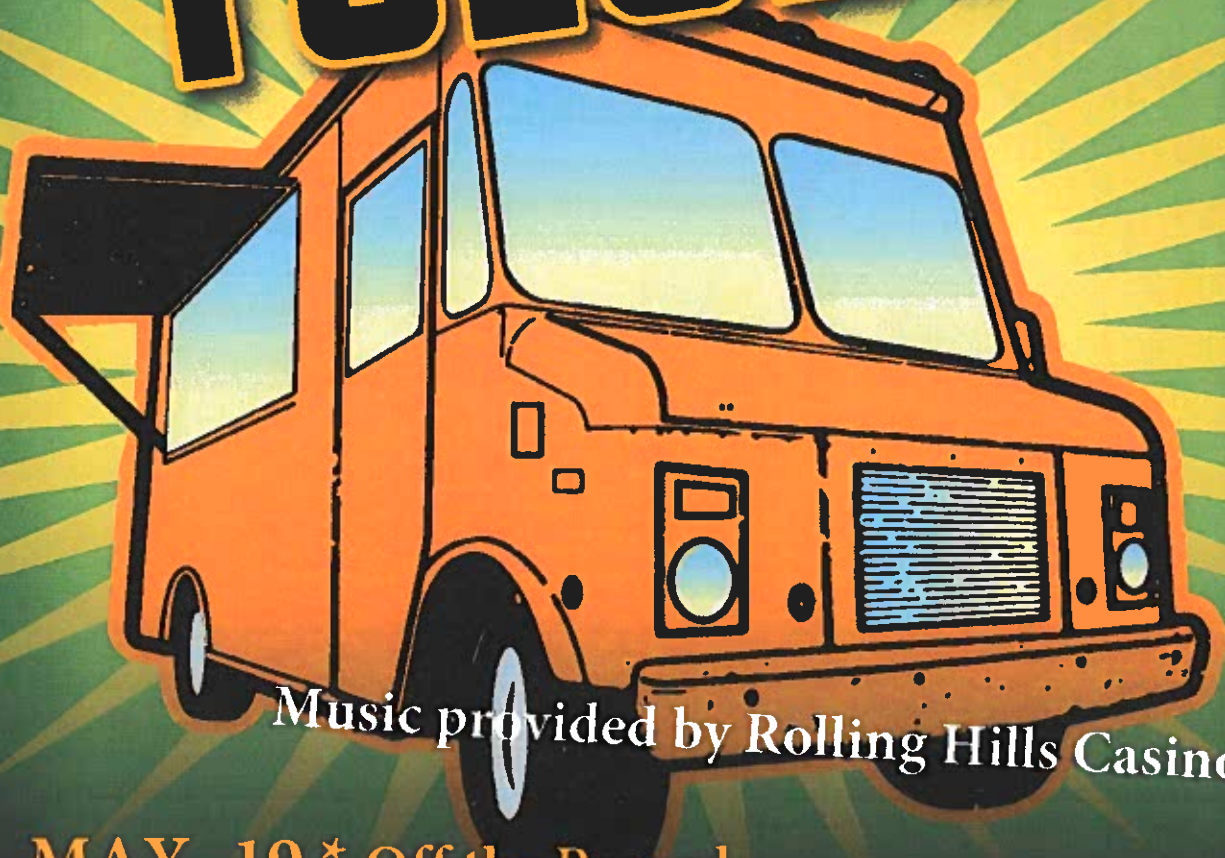
