HOLIDAYS:

City Hall, Finance and the City Corporation Yard will be closed on Monday, January 21, 2019 for Martin Luther King Jr. Day.

CITY MANAGER:

General Fund Budget

A mid-year budget update will be given to the Council at the January 22nd City Council Meeting. Overall, revenues look good.

Cannabis Regulations:

On January 16, 2019 the Office of Administrative Law officially approved State Regulations for cannabis businesses. The City sent two letters in opposition due to the proposed regulations removing local jurisdictions' authority to decide if cannabis deliveries should be allowed in their communities. The Bureau did not amend the proposed regulations as a result of concerns raised by many cities and the League of California Cities. Section 5416(d) preempts local control and regulatory authority by authorizing cannabis delivery anywhere in the State regardless of conflicting local regulations or bans. Further, delivery services are part of the retailer license. The sales tax allocation from deliveries will go to the jurisdiction where the sale originated (i.e. where the retailer is located).

Geographical Information Services (GIS):

On January 11th, Planner1/Recreation Coordinator Molly Marcussen and I met with representatives from the California State University, Chico Geographical Information Center regarding a proposed agreement to update our zoning maps and other GIS needs within the City. Our maps desperately need updating. The City budgeted \$5,000 this fiscal year to support GIS mapping needs within the City.

3rd Quarter Sales Tax Update:

On January 15th I met with a representative from Hinderliter deLlamas (HdL). The State upgraded its sales tax reporting software, which was a less than smooth transition resulting in late/missing payments that cannot be attributed to the appropriate quarter. As a result, quarterly comparisons are not possible. For FY 2018/19 the estimated sales tax revenues are estimated at \$2,878,000, which is \$113,000 more than budgeted. The increase is due to missing payments from FY 2017/18, and revenue from the truck stops and auto sales being positive.

Meetings:

- **January 17th:** I attended a meeting with the Tehama County Chief Administrator, Red Bluff City Manager and Tehama County Schools Superintendent.
- **January 18th:** City Fire & Police Chiefs, Planning Staff, Tehama County Health Services Agency, Mental Health Division Staff, and Project Developers will be meeting to discuss a multi-family housing project that will house and provide services for Veterans, Mental Health Clients and the General Population.

PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT:

Director of Public Works / City Engineer Schedule:

Due to the Martin Luther King Jr. Holiday on Monday January 21, 2019, Robin will be at City Hall on Wednesday January 23, 2019 and Friday January 25, 2019.

Waterline Repair:

An automobile accident on Tuesday January 15, 2019 on I-5 resulted in a vehicle hitting the backflow device for the Caltrans Rest Stop water service. Public Works Crews were able to isolate the service and are working with Caltrans on the repairs of the service line, meter and backflow device.

POLICE DEPARTMENT:

Patrol:

In addition to responding to 196 calls for service, a total of 38 officer reports were taken and there were 103 officer-initiated incidents, including 42 traffic stops. Officers made 17 misdemeanor and 3 felony arrests. Officers issued 27 citations, of which; 20 were misdemeanors, 7 were infractions during the period of January 9, 2019 through January 16, 2019.

Training:

Officers continue to participate in POST Portal Training and Lexipol Daily Training Bulletins. Other POST on-line training continues for Patrol and Dispatch personnel. Several Officers attended Critical Incident for Field Officers in Redding, CA.

Vehicle Abatement:

Due to the continuing light-duty of CSO Robbins, no vehicle abatement has been initiated.

FIRE DEPARTMENT:

Call Volume:

The Corning Volunteer Fire Department responded to 33 calls for service last week; they consisted of 25 medicals, 2 fires, 4 traffic collisions and 2 public service calls.

Orland and Capay Fire:

Orland and Capay Volunteer Fire Departments responded to 15 calls for service last week; they consisted of 10 medicals, 1 fire, 3 traffic collisions and 1 public service.

Training:

Training for the Corning Volunteer Fire Department consisted of debriefing of recent fires and review of the administration of NARCAN.
