### **CITY MANAGER:**

#### **Negotiations with Waste Management:**

I met with Waste Management to negotiate the Franchise Hauling Agreement on January 22<sup>nd</sup>.

#### **Proposition 47 Quarterly Advisory Committee Meeting and Progress Reporting:**

I met with the project evaluator Tom Forbes and conducted the 2<sup>nd</sup> Cohort 2 Quarterly Advisory Committee Meeting. The young adult (ages 18-26) portion of the program is in the initial stages of implementation. Six young adult clients are being served thus far. The youth portion of the program is in its third year of implementation. The \$3.5 M grant is able to provide mental health counseling, case coordination, substance use treatment, housing assistance, job training, and paid work experience to 150 18-26 year old's, and 50 12-18 year old's over the course of the next three years. Empower Tehama will be meeting with local police departments to encourage referrals into the program. Referrals to the young adult program can be made by anyone to Empower Tehama. Referrals to the youth program can be made to River Cities Counseling. Clients can refer themselves in the program as well. Please contact me should any questions arise.

#### **Mid-Year Budget Review:**

I will be meeting with Department Heads to complete the mid-year budget review next week. I also met with Hinderliter de Llamas (HdL) on January 22<sup>nd</sup> to review sales tax receipts for the 3<sup>rd</sup> quarter of 2019. HdL projects sales tax receipts for FY (Fiscal Year) 2019/2020 to be \$3,054,868, which is 1.3% less than FY 2018/2019 actuals. FY 2021/2022 sales tax receipts are projected to increase to \$3,120,400 or a 2% increase from FY 2019/2020. Measure A sales tax receipts for FY 2019/2020 are estimated to be \$1,203,000. By FY 2021/2022 Measure A sales tax receipts are projected to increase to \$1,229,000, a 2.2% increase from FY 2019/2020. I will present the mid-year budget review to the City Council in February.

#### **Accounting Assistant Interviews and Testing:**

Accounting Assistant interviews and testing will be conducted on January 24<sup>th</sup>. I hope to have the new employee on board by mid February.

#### **Meetings:**

**January 24<sup>th</sup>:** I will be attending the Regional City Manager's Meeting in Elk Grove.

**February 5-7th:** I will be attending the League of Cities' City Manager's Meeting.

### **PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT:**

#### **Chain & Hoist Installation:**

The Contractor has completed the installation of the new Chain & Hoists at the Wastewater Treatment Plant.

## **POLICE DEPARTMENT:**

### **Patrol:**

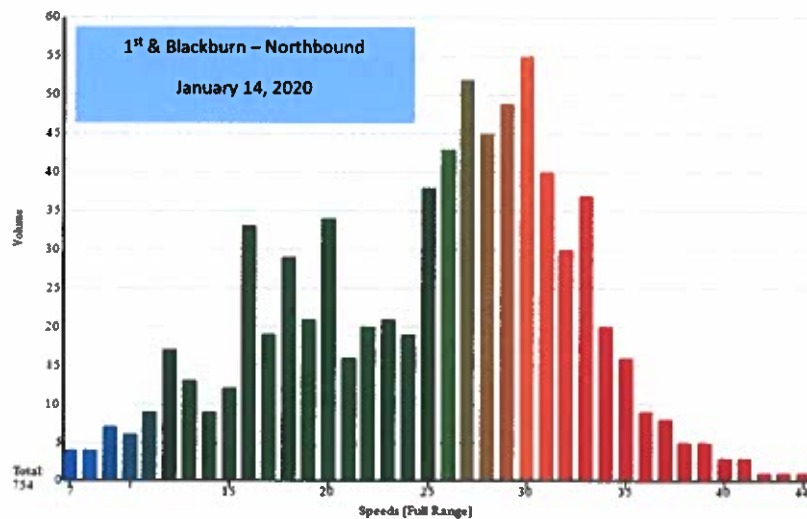
In addition to responding to 159 calls for service, a total of 25 officer reports were taken and there were 106 officer-initiated incidents, including 62 traffic stops. Officers made 12 misdemeanor and 3 felony arrests. Officers issued 25 citations, of which; 15 were misdemeanors, 5 were parking, 1 was animal and 4 were infractions during the period of January 15, 2020 through January 22, 2020.

### **Training:**

Officers continue to participate in POST Portal Training and Lexipol Daily Training Bulletins. Other POST on-line training continues for Patrol and Dispatch personnel. This week we have one Officer in training: Defensive Tactic Instructor course; and a Dispatcher in POST Public Safety course.

## **FIRE DEPARTMENT:**

### **Corning Volunteer Fire Department Call Volume:**

The Corning Volunteer Fire Department responded to 12 calls for service last week which consisted of: 9 medicals, 1 fire, 1 hazardous condition, and 1 public service assist.

### **Orland, Capay, Artois, Bayliss, Glenn Codora Ord Bend and Call Volume:**

These Volunteer Departments responded to a total of 16 dispatches for service last week which consisted of: 8 medicals, 1 fire, 2 traffic collisions, 1 gas leak, 1 investigation and 3 public service.

### **Corning Volunteer Fire Department Training:**

Training for the Corning Volunteer Fire Department consisted of ladder work on Truck 3 and cleaning, identifying and inventory on Engine 14.
