CITY MANAGER:

CASP Inspections:

Inspector Victor Felix of California Certified Accessibility Specialists, Inc. (CALCASP) will be here on Wednesday, January 30th to begin his review of nineteen (19) City facilities to aid in the preparation of the City's ADA (Americans with Disabilities Act) Transition Plan.

Proposition 47 Restore Program Grant:

On January 24th I met with representatives from the Tehama County Health Services Agency, Tehama County Department of Social Services, Tehama County Probation, and River Cities Counseling regarding the next Proposition 47 Grant Cycle. Applications are due March 18th. It is not known at this time if the City of Corning will be the lead applicant. The application may be expanded to offer services to transitional age youth.

Possible Closure of West Street between Marin and South Streets:

Staff met internally about the process and what would need to occur to close West Street between Marina and South Streets. Staff will be meeting next with the Corning School Superintendent to further discuss the possible closure.

Meetings:

- **January 25th:** I am attending the Sacramento Valley City Managers Department Meeting in Folsom and meeting with other regional City Manager's to discuss the Town of Paradise, their recovery and how we may assist with the benefits of Police/Community relations.
- **Week of February 11th:** I will be attending the League of California Cities City Manager's Meeting.

PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT:

Streets:

Caltrans has notified the City that they will be installing another set of Traffic Count Devices within the City Limits and surrounding areas next week, January 28th through February 1st. The data collected under this contract will also be provided to the City for our use.

Blackburn Waterline Repair:

Public Works Crews have inspected the City owned water meter, valve and connecting pipes and have found no damage resulting from the automobile accident on Tuesday, January 15, 2019 on I-5. Caltrans is currently working on the repairs to the Backflow Device and we anticipate the project to be completed by next week.

POLICE DEPARTMENT:

Patrol:

In addition to responding to 183 calls for service, a total of 26 officer reports were taken and there were 116 officer-initiated incidents, including 68 traffic stops. Officers made 10 misdemeanor and 1 felony arrests. Officers issued 19 citations, of which; 11 were misdemeanors, 5 were infractions, 3 were parking during the period of January 16, 2019 through January 23, 2019.

Training:

Officers continue to participate in POST Portal Training and Lexipol Daily Training Bulletins. Other POST on-line training continues for Patrol and Dispatch personnel.

Vehicle Abatement:

Due to the continuing light-duty of CSO Robbins, no vehicle abatement has been initiated.

FIRE DEPARTMENT:

Call Volume:

The Corning Volunteer Fire Department responded to 25 calls for service last week; they consisted of 22 medicals, 2 fires, and 1 public service call.

Orland and Capay Fire:

Orland and Capay Volunteer Fire Departments responded to 16 calls for service last week; they consisted of 4 medicals, 1 fire, 3 traffic collisions, 3 public service, 1 powerline down, 2 electrical hazards and 3 investigations.
