THE CORNING FRIDAY NOTES

CITY MANAGER:

New Phone Service Provider for City Hall:

Due to ongoing service-related issues, City Staff will be asking the Council to approve an Agreement with TPX to replace our existing phone services with AT&T for City Hall (except dispatch). Corning High School currently utilizes TPX and are happy with their service. There will also be a cost savings to the City as part of the new Agreement of about \$3,000 annually.

PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT:

PAL Flooring:

City Staff has completed removing the existing vinyl flooring in the PAL room located at the Corning Transportation Center and sealing the existing concrete floor.

City Hall Exterior Repair Project:

The Contractor, Cut-In Edge Painting is diligently working on the City Hall Building Exterior. Painting, crack repair, sealing and the stucco damage replacement is in process. Public access to City Hall, the Finance Department and the Police Department will remain open during business hours throughout the project.

Vandalism:

Over 10 sprinklers have been damaged at the Corning Community Park on both the Skate Park and Lennox Fields.

Concrete Contract:

City Staff has been working on negotiations for a Contractor interested in the 3-year Concrete Agreement. Negotiations have been finalized with Evan Johnson Construction and the Agreement is in the final stages of completion. In July 2018 the City received no bids for the project. On November 13, 2018 Council authorized Staff to negotiate this Agreement with a qualified Contractor.

POLICE DEPARTMENT:

Patrol:

In addition to responding to 220 calls for service, a total of 36 officer reports were taken and there were 129 officer-initiated incidents, including 59 traffic stops. Officers made 11 misdemeanor and 8 felony arrests. Officers issued 26 citations, of which; 9 were misdemeanors, 8 were parking, 2 were felony, 1 was animal and 6 were infractions during the period of July 10, 2019 through July 17, 2019.

Training:

Officers continue to participate in POST Portal Training and Lexipol Daily Training Bulletins. Other POST on-line training continues for Patrol and Dispatch personnel. On July 10 several Officers attended Highway Interdiction-Criminal Apprehension.

FIRE DEPARTMENT:

Call Volume/Response:

Corning Volunteer Fire Department Call Volume:

The Corning Volunteer Fire Department responded to 31 calls for service last week; they consisted of 25 medicals, 4 fires, and 2 traffic collisions.

Orland and Capay Volunteer Fire Department Call Volumes:

The Orland and Capay Volunteer Fire Departments were dispatched to a total of 14 calls for service last week, they consisted of: 5 medicals, 5 fires, 2 traffic collisions, and 2 public service.

Artois, Bayliss, Glenn Codora and Ord Bend Fire Department Call Volumes:

The Artois, Bayliss, Glenn Codora and Ord Bend Fire Departments were dispatched to a total of 5 calls for service last week which consisted of 3 medicals, 1 traffic collision and 1 public service.

Volunteer Training:

Training for the Corning Volunteer Fire Department consisted of 14 members doing live wildland fire training emphasizing:

- Report of conditions;
- Incident Command; and
- Assigning in-coming engines.
