### **CITY MANAGER:**

#### **FY 2017/18 Financial Statements (Independent Audit):**

The Audit will be presented to the City Council at the March 26<sup>th</sup> City Council meeting.

#### **Food TRUCK Tuesday is HERE again!:**

The dates for this summer's Food Truck Tuesday events are as follows:

The Paskenta Band of Nomlaki Indians (Tribe) has again agreed to provide the band for all four events. Please make sure to thank the Tribe for their contributions to these fun family events.

#### **Waste Management Negotiations:**

Waste Management agreed to further evaluate their commercial rates. They also agreed to forego their annual rate increase until the contract extension is finalized.

Glenn County and the Cities of Willows and Orland are currently evaluating proposals from Waste Management and Waste Connections for hauling and transfer services.

#### **2nd Grade Swim Lesson Program:**

City Staff are currently working with the Elementary and High School Superintendents to organize the Second Annual week long 2<sup>nd</sup> Grade Swim Lesson Program.

#### **Upcoming Meetings:**

**March 21<sup>st</sup>:** I am meeting with the Red Bluff City Manager, Tehama County Chief Administrator, and Tehama County School Superintendent.

**March 26<sup>th</sup>:** I am meeting with Corning Chamber President Laura Fierce and Chamber Executive Director Renae Beckley.

**March 29<sup>th</sup>:** I will be attending the Sacramento Valley City Manager's Meeting on March 29<sup>th</sup>.

**April 2<sup>nd</sup> & 3<sup>rd</sup>:** As Chair of the California Product Stewardship Council I will be attending their annual meeting and lobby day at the State Capitol.

### **BUILDING DEPARTMENT:**

#### **iWorQs:**

Thanks to the diligence and hard work of Public Works Administrative Secretary Angel Garman, the Building Department's electronic permit files have been migrated from the old TRAK IT System to the new iWorQ's System. This is a big upgrade to the Building Department and Code Enforcement.

## **PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT:**

### **South Ave. Closure:**

Union Pacific Rail Road (UPRR) is planning to complete major railroad crossing repair work starting April 2, 2019 thru April 5, 2019 at both crossing locations of South Avenue outside the City Limits. In order to complete this work South Avenue will be closed between HWY 99W and HWY 99E; exact closures are not known at this time. UPRR is working with Caltrans and Tehama County regarding this closure and associated detours. **See attached fact sheet supplied by Caltrans.**

### **Clark Park Lighting:**

The 2 lights that were accessible by the Fire Department ladder truck have been replaced and are in working order. The remaining 3 lights are in an area that cannot be accessed by the ladder truck and a lift will need to be rented to replace these lights. As soon as the field is dry enough for the lift, the replacement of the remaining 3 light will occur.

## **POLICE DEPARTMENT:**

### **Patrol:**

In addition to responding to 204 calls for service, a total of 35 officer reports were taken and there were 166 officer-initiated incidents, including 106 traffic stops. Officers made 28 misdemeanor and 3 felony arrests. Officers issued 35 citations, of which; 26 misdemeanors, 6 infractions, 1 felony, 1 parking, and 1 unclassified during the period of March 13, 2019 through March 20, 2019.

### **Training:**

Officers continue to participate in POST Portal Training and Lexipol Daily Training Bulletins. Other POST on-line Training continues for Patrol and Dispatch personnel. One Officer attended Gang Awareness Training.

### **Vehicle Abatement:**

Due to the continuing light-duty of CSO Robbins, no vehicle abatement has been initiated.

## **FIRE DEPARTMENT:**

### **Corning Volunteer Fire Department Call Volume:**

The Corning Volunteer Fire Department responded to 13 calls for service last week; they consisted of 12 medicals and 1 vehicle fire.

### **Orland Volunteer Fire Department Call Volume:**

The Orland Volunteer Fire Department responded 18 calls for service last week, they consisted of 15 medicals, 1 investigation, and 2 traffic collisions.

### **Capay Volunteer Fire Department Call Volume:**

The Capay Volunteer Fire Department was dispatched to 3 medicals last week.

### **Training:**

Training for the Corning Volunteer Fire Department consisted of pump practice and engine operations.

# UNION PACIFIC RAILROAD CROSSING MAINTENANCE

**UNION PACIFIC RAILROAD** will be performing maintenance at the crossing located on South Avenue between Stephens Road and Rowles Road in Tehama County. The crossing maintenance is part of a larger Union Pacific Railroad project that will perform maintenance to a number of crossings along their tracks between Lincoln and Lakehead. In order to complete the maintenance, Union Pacific Railroad will be completely closing the crossing for approximately four (4) days.

Union Pacific Railroad officials plan to close the crossing and begin repairs on Tuesday, April 2, 2019 at midnight. The crossing repairs are anticipated to be completed by Friday, April 5, 2019.

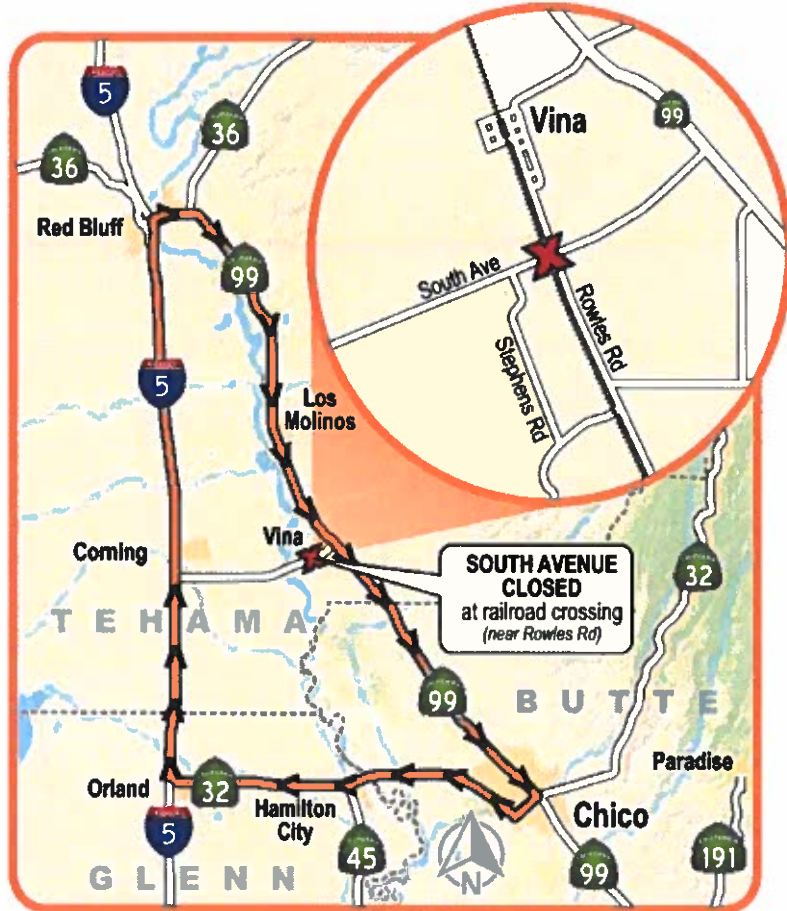
