CITY MANAGER:

Recycle Night at the Theatre March 8TH:

The Tehama County Solid Waste Management Agency is partnering with the Corning Recreation Program to host Recycle Night at Rodgers Theatre. Activities and a craft will be offered to teach youth in our community how to recycle/reduce their waste. The movie 'Lorax' will be shown. Doors will open at 5:45 PM. This will be a free event. Advance registration will be required online through Corning Recreation.

Woodson Bridge RV Park Residents at Clark Park:

The County in its emergency declaration is allowing those residents displaced from Woodson Bridge RV Park to locate at River Park (located adjacent to Woodson Bridge RV Park) for a period of seven (7) days to accommodate the Little League Opening Day Ceremonies. The trailers should all be removed from Clark Park by Friday afternoon to allow clean-up of the park in advance of Opening Day.

Fiscal Year 2019/2020 Budget Development and Capital Improvement Plans:

Department Heads will be preparing their Capital Improvement Plan adjustments for internal review and consideration. The Plans are due by April 12th. I will begin meeting with Department Heads regarding their respective budgets on April 12th.

FY 2017/18 Financial Statements (Independent Audit):

I anticipated Don Reynolds presenting the FY 2017/18 Financial Statements to the City Council at the March 12th City Council Meeting. Mr. Reynolds' mother passed away and he will not be available to present the audit until March 26th.

Corning Municipal Code Updates:

City Attorney Collin Bogener is updating the Municipal Code one chapter at a time. Two Chapters of updates will be presented at the March 12th City Council meeting for Council consideration.

Proposition 47 Cycle 2 Grant Application:

The Cycle 2 Grant Application is due March 18th. Much of my time next week will be consumed with finalizing the application. A Resolution related to the Proposition 47 Program Grant Agreement will be on March 12th City Council Agenda.

Recreation:

Spring Classes:

Corning Recreation has opened registration for Spring Session of classes. As of 3/6/2019 we are offering 28 classes but expect to add more classes as time goes on.

POLICE DEPARTMENT:

Patrol:

In addition to responding to 162 calls for service, a total of 33 officer reports were taken and there were 86 officer-initiated incidents, including 51 traffic stops. Officers made 18 misdemeanor and 4 felony arrests. Officers issued 22 citations, of which; 16 were misdemeanors, and 6 were infractions during the period of February 28, 2019 through March 6, 2019.

Training:

Officers continue to participate in POST Portal Training and Lexipol Daily Training Bulletins. Other POST on-line Training continues for Patrol and Dispatch personnel.

Vehicle Abatement:

Due to the continuing light-duty of CSO Robbins, no vehicle abatement has been initiated.

FIRE DEPARTMENT:

Corning Volunteer Fire Department Call Volume:

The Corning Volunteer Fire Department responded to 28 calls for service last week; they consisted of 20 medicals, 3 traffic collisions, 2 investigations and 3 public service calls.
