VACATIONS:

Interim Public Works Director Robin Kampmann: Friday, May 10th – Monday, May 20th. Angel or Steve will be handling Public Works related issues while she is out.

CITY MANAGER:

FY 2019/20 Budget:

Roy Seiler and I met on Monday May 13th to continue work on the FY 2019/20 budget. I will be meeting with HdL regarding projected sales tax and transactions and use tax (Measure A) revenue on May 21, 2019. Roy and I will be working on the budget again on May 20th.

Franchise Hauling Agreement with Waste Management (WMI):

I will be meeting with Waste Management representatives on May 17, 2019 to finalize the Agreement. I hope to present the Agreement to the City Council in June.

Shelter Services Agreement:

The Agreement for the County to accept Corning dogs at the Animal Shelter in Red Bluff was finalized by Staff. The Agreement will be presented to the City Council at the May 28th City Council meeting. Impounded dogs will have to be picked up in Red Bluff. Some fees assessed to the public will need to be increased. The Agreement will take effect October 1st, at which time the outdated Corning Animal shelter will close.

Water and Sewer Line Extension to the Westside of Interstate 5:

Staff are continuing work with project developers to extend water and sewer infrastructure on the west side of Interstate 5 at Corning Road and South Avenue.

Proposition 68 Park Grant Application Development:

Staff are continuing work on the application for the Proposition 68 Park Development and Community Revitalization grant. At the meeting on May 14th community members chose the design and look of recreation features. The next meeting will be held June 1st at 6:00 p.m. at the City Council Chambers. Staff are beginning work on the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) document for the project. The City will retain the services of Diaz and Associates to complete the Initial Study for the CEQA analysis. Staff will also be obtaining letters of intent to sell from each property owner and conducting appraisals.

Promise Neighborhood Grant Meetings:

I will be attending two meetings regarding the Promise Neighborhood Grant on May 23rd.

Economic Development:

The Façade Working Group will be meeting on May 23rd.

Meetings/Events:

RECREATION DEPARTMENT:**Recreation New Session Classes:**

Corning Recreation Summer Programs are open for registration. We have 41 classes and are still adding more. We are also pleased to announce we have brought on a new Dance Instructor, Corning's very own Maddie Vinson. She will be teaching teen dance classes at Rodgers Theatre. We plan to run four summer camps this summer, a Dance Camp, Theatre Camp, Sports Camp and Basketball Camp.

Planning:

We have contracted with Chico States Geographical Information Center to do GIS zoning updates. Our current zoning map has not been updated since 2006 and the City did several rezones in 2016. The updated zoning map will help planning staff and community members find information much quicker.

Planning Staff is working with Diaz and Associates on the Prop 68 Park Grant CEQA document.

PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT:**Fairview and Elizabeth Streets Project:**

The Contractor, SnL Group, Inc. has started the Street Project, working on both streets simultaneously. They have started with the hydrant installations and water lines.

Training:

- JC Pendergraft will be attending the Certified Pool Operator (CPO) training in Chico Monday May 20th and Tuesday May 21st.
- Friday, May 10th Asst. Public Works Director Steve Lindeman and Troy Grootveld attended a Cal OSHA Compliance seminar in Red Bluff to ensure the City stays compliant with any new requirements. One of the things they learned is that Crew Members are required to be CPR and First Aid Certified. Public Works is in the process of scheduling a training session to make sure the Crew is updated and certified.

FIRE DEPARTMENT:**Corning Volunteer Fire Department Call Volume:**

The Corning Volunteer Fire Department responded to 22 calls for service last week; they consisted of 14 medicals, 3 mutual aids fires, 1 structure fire, 1 mutual aid traffic collision, 1 investigation and 2 public service.

Orland Volunteer Fire Department Call Volume:

The Orland Volunteer Fire Department was dispatched to 16 calls for service last week, they consisted of 11 medicals, 3 traffic collision, 1 investigation and 1 public service.

Capay Volunteer Fire Department Call Volume:

The Capay Volunteer Fire Department was dispatched to 1 medical aid.
