HOLIDAY CLOSURES:

City Hall will be closed on Monday, May 27th for Memorial Day.

CITY MANAGER:

FY 2019/20 Budget:

Roy Seiler, Mary Brimm and I will finalize the FY 2019/2020 budget on May 28th.

Meeting with the Paskenta Band of Nomlaki Indians:

I attended two meetings with the Tribe on May 23rd to discuss the development of the Tribe's Hazard Mitigation Plan and the Promise Neighborhood Grant.

4th Quarter 2018 Sales Tax Meeting:

I met with Hinderliter de Llamas (HdL) to review 4th Quarter sales tax results and projections for FY 2019/2020. HdL projects sales tax receipts will decline in FY 2019/2020 due to double payments received in FY 2018/2019. The double payments were due to the State implementing a new reporting software system. There were issues in the transition resulting in sales tax to be received in FY 2018/2019 from sales in FY 2017/2018.

Energy Efficiency Improvement Project with AirCon Energy:

City Staff met with AirCon Energy on May 20th to discuss issues completing various aspects of the project.

July 16th, August 20th, and October 8th: Food Truck Tuesday event from 5 p.m. to 8 p.m. on Solano Street between 4th and 5th Streets.

PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT:

Fairview and Elizabeth Streets Project:

The Contractor, SnL Group, Inc. has been actively working on the Street Project, working on both streets simultaneously. Underground utility installation work is wrapping up. Excavation for the new curb and gutter is occurring and it is anticipated that they will be grinding/pulverizing the asphalt the beginning of next week.

Community Events:

The Corning Chamber of Commerce will be starting the weekly Farmers Market on Thursday nights from 5 – 8 p.m. at Northside Park on June 6th.

Training:

- JC Pendergraft completed the Certified Pool Operator (CPO) training in Chico Monday May 20th and Tuesday May 21st.

- Jeremy Mosher attended a USA North 811 Training on Wednesday, May 22nd to review the new USA North 811 requirements. City Staff is in the process of setting up an onsite training with USA North 811 to review the requirements with all Public Works Staff.

FIRE DEPARTMENT:

Corning Volunteer Fire Department Call Volume:

The Corning Volunteer Fire Department responded to 21 calls for service last week; they consisted of 15 medicals, 2 mutual traffic collisions, 1 public service, 1 traffic collision, 1 investigation and 1 fire.

Orland Volunteer Fire Department Call Volume:

The Orland Volunteer Fire Department was dispatched to 11 calls for service last week, they consisted of 4 medicals, 1 fire, 1 traffic collision, 1 hazardous situation and 4 public service.

Capay Volunteer Fire Department Call Volume:

The Capay Volunteer Fire Department was dispatched to 1 fire.

Training:

Training for the Corning Volunteer Fire Department consisted of pump and engine operations on Engine 12 and wildland review with Engine 6.

Engine 12:

New Engine 12 was officially put into service Friday.

Burn Ban:

The ban on burning in the City and the County begins Friday, May 31st.
