CITY MANAGER:

Proposition 68 Park Development and Community Revitalization Grant:

The second Community Meeting for the Prop 68 Park Development and Community Revitalization grant will be held May 9th at 6 p.m. at the Corning City Council Chambers. During this meeting community members will prioritize recreation features discussed at the last community meeting. Groups thus far have suggested the following in no particular order:

- Community Center/Gym/Recreation Center with snack bar, office, and kitchen;
- Dog Park;
- Outdoor exercise area with walking path;
- City plaza/amphitheater;
- Tables with chess boards;
- Splash pad;
- Law Enforcement/Fire Memorial;
- Musical-based play;
- Parkcore;
- Rock climbing wall;
- Mini golf;
- Toddler area;
- Grassy area;
- Indoor Olympic-sized pool; and
- ADA play equipment.

Waste Water Treatment Plant Operations:

I met with representatives from Inframark on April 30th, whereby they emphasized their commitment to the City and desire to become more involved in the community.

Economic Development:

The Corning Economic Development Action Committee will be conducting a business walk on May 3rd. I will be giving a presentation in Paradise to the business and development community about challenges and opportunities in development post Camp Fire on May 6th.

Food Truck Tuesday:

The first "Food Truck Tuesday" event will take place on May 7th from 5-8 p.m. on Solano Street between 6th Street and 4th Street; Inside Straits (Band) will be performing from 6-8 p.m.

RECREATION DEPARTMENT:

May 4th Cinco-De-Mayo Fiesta at Corning Community Park:

Corning Recreation will be hosting a booth at the Cinco De Mayo Fiesta in Corning Community Park this Saturday from 10-4 p.m. We will be outreaching to families on our summer recreation classes, making homemade maracas with the kids, showcasing our art classes Mexican Folk Art

pieces, and be conducting a survey asking folks what recreation features they would like to see in our Prop 68 Park Grant.

PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT:

Community Events:

The Latino Outreach of Tehama County is hosting a Cinco de Mayo event at the Corning Community Skate Park on Saturday May 4, 2019 from 10:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. Although there will be no road closures, please be aware that an event with large attendance is expected at the Corning Community Park (Skate Park) which may impact ease of road access not only on Toomes and Houghton Avenues, but the surrounding side streets as well. Emergency Personnel have been notified by memo.

Energy Conservation Project:

Aircon Energy has replaced the 2 HVAC units at City Hall and will be completing the duct testing this next week. We are still on track for completing this work mid-May.

POLICE DEPARTMENT:

Patrol:

In addition to responding to 171 calls for service, a total of 25 officer reports were taken and there were 69 officer-initiated incidents, including 37 traffic stops. Officers made 12 misdemeanor and 1 felony arrests. Officers issued 18 citations, of which; 13 were misdemeanors, 2 were felony, and 3 were infractions during the period of April 24, 2019 through May 1, 2019.

Training:

Officers continue to participate in POST Portal Training and Lexipol Daily Training Bulletins. Other POST on-line training continues for Patrol and Dispatch personnel.

Vehicle Abatement:

Due to the continuing light-duty of CSO Robbins, no vehicle abatement has been initiated.

Corning Volunteer Fire Department Call Volume:

The Corning Volunteer Fire Department responded to 18 calls for service last week; they consisted of 15 medicals, 1 fire, 1 mutual aid fire, and 1 investigation.
