HOLIDAYS:

City Hall, Finance and the City Corporation Yard will be closed on the following days during the Holiday Season:

- Thanksgiving: Thursday and Friday, November 22nd & 23rd
- Christmas: Monday and Tuesday, December 24th & 25th
- New Year's Day: Tuesday, January 1, 2019.

CITY MANAGER:

I will be taking Wednesday November 21st and Monday November 26th off to visit family over the Thanksgiving holiday.

Camp Fire Displaced Residents Trailer and RV Parking at Estil Clark Park:

The City has opened the parking lot at Estil Clark Park for those individuals displaced by the recent Camp Fire having trailers and motor homes for temporary use. Proof of residence within the areas affected by the fire will be required and no tents will be allowed.

Because the City does not have water/sewer hook-ups to accommodate this use, the City has contacted Big Valley Sanitation, Inc. of Redding who has agreed to provide sewer pump services to each trailer/motor home owner as needed at a cost of \$25 per service.

Northern California Cities' Self Insurance Fund Meeting:

I attended an NCCSIF Executive Committee meeting on November 19th to discuss contract renewals with service providers.

OE3 Health Insurance:

Senior Accounting Technician Mary Brimm and I met with OE3 Board Trustee Tim Neep on November 20th to attempt to resolve employees' health insurance coverage issues. We are continuing to work through the issues.

CalPERS 457 Plan Review Meeting:

On November 20th Senior Accounting Technician Mary Brimm and I had a phone conference with CalPERS to review the City's 457 Plan.

Employee Christmas Party/Service Year Award Presentation:

The Employee Christmas Party will be held at the City Fire Hall Annex on Friday, December 14th from 12:00 p.m. to 1:30 p.m.

PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT:

Senior Center:

Per Clean Rite Build Rite (Contractor), the project is complete. Building Official Dan Redding performed the final inspection and is working with Public Works Director Robin Kampmann to compile a punch list of items that need to be corrected/completed prior to the final Progress Pay Estimate and Notice of Completion being issued.

Hometown Christmas Parade:

Solano Street between Houghton Avenue and 3rd Street will be closed on Saturday, December 1, 2018 beginning at 5:30 p.m. for the Hometown Christmas Lighted Parade. The staging will take place on Yolo and Houghton prior to the event.

Development Projects:

The Stonefox Subdivision Phase 2 & 3 has been paved in addition to the portion of Carona Avenue that was disturbed for the utility installation.

Annual Leaf Pick-Up:

The Public Works Crew will continue leaf pick-up as work schedules allow. At this time there has not been much participation. Leaf piles must not have branches, brush or other debris or they will not be removed. With the forecasted rains, please make sure leaf piles are not blocking street gutters preventing water flow.

POLICE DEPARTMENT:

Patrol:

In addition to responding to 208 calls for service, a total of 41 officer reports were taken and there were 125 officer-initiated incidents, including 79 traffic stops. Officers made 9 misdemeanor and 2 felony arrests. Officers issued 19 citations, of which; 11 were misdemeanors and 8 were infractions during the period of November 13, 2018 through November 20, 2018.

Training:

Officers continue to participate in POST Portal Training and Lexipol Daily Training Bulletins. Other Officer Field Training and Dispatcher Training is continuing.

Vehicle Abatement:

Due to the continuing light-duty of CSO Robbins, no vehicle abatement has been initiated.

FIRE DEPARTMENT:

Call Volume:

The Corning Volunteer Fire Department responded to 21 calls for service last week. They were: 12 medical, 2 mutual aid fires, 2 fires, 1 investigation, 3 public service, and 1 false alarm. The Department had one Engine manned with 4 volunteer Firefighters assigned to the Camp Fire that returned on Tuesday, November 20, 2018.

Orland Fire Department was dispatched to 18 calls for service last week consisting of 12 medicals, 2 traffic collisions, 2 fires, 1 mutual aid fire, and 1 public service. They had 1 Engine and 3 Firefighters assigned to the Camp Fire that also returned on Tuesday, November 20, 2018.

Capay Fire Department responded to 2 medical aids.

Events:

Corning Volunteer Fire Department Raffle: The Corning Volunteers are currently selling tickets for their annual raffle. Proceeds go towards their Christmas baskets and the Department.
