### **CITY MANAGER:**

#### **Camp Fire in Paradise:**

Both the Police and Fire Departments sent personnel to respond to the Camp Fire in Paradise, CA. I authorized full use of the Corning Municipal Airport to CalFire as they anticipate it will be too smoky to continue to use the Chico Municipal Airport here shortly. I informed the Fixed Base Operators of CalFire's need.

#### **Meeting with Paskenta Band of Nomlaki Indians:**

Building Official Dan Redding, Councilmember Chuy Valerio, and I met with the Tribe about plan approval timeliness and processes. City Staff are going to work to create better lines of communication to make the processes go smoother.

#### **Proposition 47 Board of State and Community Corrections- Restore Program Grant:**

I met with River Cities' Counseling regarding grant expense reporting and progress report reviewal on November 8<sup>th</sup>. There will be an all grantee conference call on November 24<sup>th</sup>.

#### **Office 365:**

Computer Logistics transitioned all Staff to Office 365 this week. Among other benefits, this should eliminate some of the spam emails that are coming through, as well as provide Staff with the most current Microsoft Office products to use.

#### **Meeting with OE3 Union Representative Art Frolli:**

Senior Accounting Technician Mary Brimm and I met with Art Frolli to help him better understand the issues regarding OE3 medical insurance on November 7<sup>th</sup>.

### **PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT:**

#### **Veteran's Day Parade:**

David Blanchard VFW Post 4218 will be hosting the annual Veterans Day Parade on Sunday, November 11<sup>th</sup> beginning at Corning City Hall at 1:00 p.m. The procession will end at the Veteran's Memorial Hall at the corner of Solano Street and Houghton Avenue. Solano Street closure will begin approximately at 12:30 p.m. to prepare for the parade and will re-open when the parade is finished.

#### **Annual Leaf Pick-Up:**

Public Works will begin leaf pick-up mid-November as work schedules allow. Leaf piles must contain leaves only; if branches, brush or other debris is present the piles will not be picked up. Please ensure leaf piles do not block street gutters that could prevent water flow.

**Street Impacts:**

The Contractor for the Stonefox Subdivision is finalizing the utility connections within the Carona Avenue right-of-way and anticipates completing the grading and curb, gutter and sidewalk installation the beginning of next week. Paving will immediately follow these installations.

**Thank you to Tehama Solid Waste Management Agency:**

City Staff would like to acknowledge and thank the Tehama County Solid Waste Management Agency for assuming the tipping fees for the illegally dumped debris associated with recent abatement/cleanup efforts by Salt Creek Conservation Camp Crews in the City.

**POLICE DEPARTMENT:**

**Patrol:**

In addition to responding to 180 calls for service, a total of 37 officer reports were taken and there were 112 officer-initiated incidents, including 84 traffic stops. Officers made 18 misdemeanor and 3 felony arrests. Officers issued 29 citations, of which; 1 was a felony, 22 were misdemeanors, and 6 were infractions during the period of October 31, 2018 through November 7, 2018.

**Training:**

Officers continue to participate in POST Portal Training and Lexipol Daily Training Bulletins. Other Officer Field Training and Dispatcher Training is continuing. This week, one officer is attending FTO training and another officer is attending Report Writing Update training.

**Vehicle Abatement:**

Due to the continuing light-duty of CSO Robbins, no vehicle abatement has been initiated.

**Call Volume:**
