### **CITY MANAGER:**

#### **Energy Efficiency Improvements:**

Energy efficiency improvements to City-owned buildings will commence in the evening hours beginning the week of November 4<sup>th</sup>. The construction work should not impact most departments. AirCon Energy will coordinate work with both Dispatch Centers to ensure they are not negatively impacted.

#### **Meeting with County Librarian Todd Deck:**

Lisa Linnet, Robin Kampmann, and I met with County Librarian Todd Deck on Wednesday to discuss the following:

- City Library maintenance;
- ADA compliance;
- Possible collaboration with the Recreation Program;
- Potential grant funding to purchase new furniture; and
- An analysis to best utilize the space within the Library.

#### **Groundwater Assessment:**

The Central Valley Regional Water Quality Control Board received grant funding to conduct a groundwater assessment within the city limits of Corning. Sampling should begin in the next few months.

#### **School Parking Lot Safety:**

Molly Marcussen (City Planner 1/Recreation Coordinator) and I will be meeting with the Elementary School Superintendent about parking lot safety concerns on November 1<sup>st</sup>.

### **PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT:**

#### **Senior Center:**

This week the drywall has been installed, taped and textured. The estimated completion date for the project is November 6, 2018.

#### **Tree Trimming Contract:**

Tree trimming within the northeast and southeast quadrants is anticipated to be completed on Tuesday October 30, 2018.

#### **Community Events/Street Impact:**

Treat Street:

- ❖ Treat Street will be on Wednesday October 31, 2018 from 2:00 p.m. to 5:00 p.m. Solano Street will be closed from 1:30 p.m. to approximately 5:30 p.m. for the event between 3<sup>rd</sup> Street and Houghton Avenue for the safety of the participants.

## **POLICE DEPARTMENT:**

### **Patrol:**

In addition to responding to 203 calls for service, a total of 43 officer reports were taken and there were 109 officer-initiated incidents, including 66 traffic stops. Officers made 20 misdemeanor and 2 felony arrests. Officers issued 32 citations, of which; 19 were misdemeanors, and 13 were infractions during the period of October 17, 2018 through October 24, 2018.

### **Personnel:**

The Department is continuing to accept applications for Police Dispatcher/Clerk and Police Administrative Secretary.

### **Training:**

Officers continue to participate in POST Portal Training and Lexipol Daily Training Bulletins. Other Officer Field Training and Dispatcher Training is continuing.

### **Community:**

## **FIRE DEPARTMENT:**

### **Call Volume:**

The Corning Volunteer Fire Department responded to 15 calls for service last week. These consisted of: 11 medical aids, 1 fire, and 3 public safety.

Orland and Capay Fire Departments were dispatched to a total of 22 calls for service last week. These consisted of: 16 medicals, 4 fires, and 2 traffic collisions.

### **Training:**

Training for the Corning Volunteer Fire Department consisted of 22 members participating in mandatory hose testing on Truck 3. This included a review of pump operations and proper hose pack.
