CITY MANAGER:

COVID-19 Updates

PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT:

Public Works Crewmembers:

Public Works Crewmembers are back on winter hours of operation. Their workday begins at 7:00 a.m. and ends at 3:30 p.m. The Meter Reader/Maintenance Worker will continue his working hours of 8:00 a.m. until 4:30 p.m.

Water Leaks:

The following water leaks were repaired by City Staff this week:

Community Park Fitness Stations:

Public Works Staff poured the foundation for one of the fitness stations at Corning Community Park.

Playground Equipment:

Public Works Staff poured the footing and installed the base for the new Neutron Spinner at Northside Park. Once the concrete has cured for 7 days Staff will install the remainder of the structure and place new fall protections in the play area.
