### **CITY MANAGER:**

#### **Cannabis Ordinance:**

On September 17, 2019 the Planning Commission and City Council will consider the first reading of an Ordinance to establish a ban on commercial cultivation, processing, laboratory testing, labeling, storing, wholesale distribution and retail sale, and outdoor cultivation for personal use.

#### **Meetings:**

**September 4<sup>th</sup> & 5<sup>th</sup>:** I attended a Leadership Series to Advance Tehama County as part of the Promise Neighborhood Grant on September 4<sup>th</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup>.

**September 6<sup>th</sup>:** I attended a Proposition 47 Orientation meeting in Sacramento.

#### **Upcoming Meetings:**

**September 9<sup>th</sup>:** I am meeting with representatives from Waste Management.

### **PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT:**

#### **Public Works Crewmembers:**

Public Works Crewmembers are back on winter hours of operation. Their workday begins at 7:00 a.m. and ends at 3:30 p.m. The Meter Reader/Maintenance Worker will continue his working hours of 8:00 a.m. until 4:30 p.m.

#### **Water Line Repairs:**

The leaking water service line on Fig Street at Chestnut Street was repaired by City Staff.

#### **Elizabeth Avenue Power Poles:**

We are still on the schedule for PG&E to remove the power poles in Elizabeth Avenue for the week of September 9<sup>th</sup>.

### **PLANNING AND RECREATION DEPARTMENT:**

#### **Planning:**

##### **Diamond Plaza Use Permit:**

Planning Staff has begun the CEQA process for the Diamond Plaza Use Permit.

##### **Temporary Dwelling Unit Permits (TDU's):**

The Paradise Refugees that were living on the property along Highway 99W have relocated.

Heritage RV was granted a 6-month extension on their spaces being occupied by Camp Fire Refugees. Their permit expires on January 19, 2020.

## **POLICE DEPARTMENT:**

### **Patrol:**

In addition to responding to 195 calls for service, a total of 36 officer reports were taken and there were 125 officer-initiated incidents, including 54 traffic stops. Officers made 13 misdemeanor and 4 felony arrests. Officers issued 23 citations, of which; 15 were misdemeanors, 3 were parking, and 5 were infractions during the period of August 28, 2019 through September 4, 2019.

### **Training:**

Officers continue to participate in POST Portal Training and Lexipol Daily Training Bulletins. Other POST on-line training continues for Patrol and Dispatch personnel.

### **Corning Volunteer Fire Department Call Volume:**
